

#### **DISASTER RELIEF: SPECIFIC FUNDING FOR FLORIDA**

- Department of Agriculture:
  - \$864M for Florida farmers and growers
- National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration:
  - \$399M for new and improved hurricane hunter aircrafts
  - \$400,000 for St. Petersburg Bayboro Facility
  - \$803,000 for high-frequency radar along the Gulf Coast of FL, FL Keys, and Ft. Jefferson
  - Millions more to repair National Weather Service local weather forecasting facilities, clean up marine debris, and perform coastal mapping and charting work off the coast of Florida
- National Aeronautical and Space Administration:
  - \$152.1M for repairs at the Kennedy Space Center
- Department of Defense:
  - \$745M to make repairs at military installations, including MacDill Air Force Base
- Army Corps of Engineering:
  - \$1.6 billion in funding will go towards beach renourishment, environmental mediation, channel
    improvements, and water infrastructure in several states, including hundreds of millions for Florida
- Small Business Disaster Loans:
  - Out of 20,802 pending loan applications nationwide, 11,695 applications are from Florida (\$852.6M)
- United States Coast Guard:
  - \$312M, including for Florida Coast Guard installations in St. Petersburg and more
- National Park Service:
  - \$29M for Florida national parks and monuments
- Environmental Protection Agency:
  - From the total \$3 billion nationally, Florida would receive over half: \$1.6B to harden our water and wastewater infrastructure from future flooding events and storms
  - From a total \$85M for decentralized wastewater systems nationwide, Florida would get \$56M
- Child Care funding:
  - FL is 1 of 5 states that would be eligible for the \$250M in funding to rebuild destroyed child care facilities, purchase new equipment and provide temporary child care services
  - FL would also be eligible for the **\$250M** in emergency funding to increase access to high-quality child care services for working families
- Department of Veterans Affairs:
  - Out of the \$68M to fix VA hospitals and outpatient clinics damaged by hurricanes across the country,
     \$26.2M would come to Florida.
- Department of Housing and Urban Development:
  - \$4.04B for long-term housing and infrastructure recovery in Florida, 1/3rd of the total amount
- Department of Transportation:
  - \$421M to fix damaged roads and highways
- Federal Emergency Management Agency
  - **Hundreds of millions of dollars** from the primary federal disaster relief initiative to help with home repairs, debris removal, community mitigation and resiliency, and more
